



Poa trivialis

Winterplay *Poa trivialis* is a new darker green cultivar that more closely compliments the color of perennial ryegrass and creeping bentgrass for overseeding bermudagrass greens across the Southern 1/2 of the United States. **Winterplay** is genetically darker than other currently available varieties, and can be used as a monostand when desired. It establishes quickly and transitions out smoothly without lingering into the summer months.

Winterplay out-performed other commercial roughstalk bluegrasses in the 1992-93 winter overseeding trials in Scottsdale, Arizona.

Characteristics:

- Improved turf density
- Fine leaf texture
- Dark green color
- Transitions well
- Rapid establishment

Recommended Use:

Winter overseeding in fine turf situations such as Golf Course greens, tees and fairways and may be mixed with other species for shade applications.

Climatic Zones:

3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10 (may not be adaptable to all areas within each climatic zone)

Establishment & Maintenance:

Winterplay is compatible with ryegrass, fine fescue, and bentgrass, and will tolerate close mowing from 1/8 to 1/10 inch (3.2 – 2.5 mm). In a monostand, fertilize at the rate of 3 - 5 lbs of actual N per 1000 sq feet annually. **Winterplay** will germinate in 7 - 10 days after seeding. First mowing should occur 10 - 14 days after seeding.

Seeding Rates: (overseeding dormant warm season grasses)

- Poa Trivialis Monostand 8 – 14 lbs/1000 sq ft
(3 1/2 - 6 1/4 kgs/100 sq meters)
- With Perennial Ryegrass 3 – 5 lbs Poa Trivialis to 30 - 40 lbs Perennial
Ryegrass/1000 sq ft
(1 1/2 - 2 1/2 kgs/100 sq. meters)
- With Creeping Bentgrass 3 - 5 lbs Poa Trivialis to 3 - 5 lbs Creeping
Bentgrass/1000 sq ft
(1 1/2 - 2 1/2 kgs/100 sq. meters)
